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São João Vegetariano

Mercado de São Bartolomeu | Mercado da Alegria

Throughout the year on sundays, we can find Mercado da Alegria (Joy Market) at Jardim do Passeio Alegre, with artisanal work from local sellers. In August, this fair gives place to another one on the weekends: Mercado de São Bartolomeu (St Bartholomew's market)

Pastel de Nata

Say whaaaat? A vegan Pastel de Nata right in the city center? Yes, that's right! Right next to São Bento Station and Teatro Sá da Bandeira you'll find at Confeitaria Tupi (R. Sá da Bandeira, 144), with their amazing creamy and crunchy Pastéis de Nata. But if you are hungrier, you also find other types of snacks, cafeteria options, daily menus for lunch and much more.





Francesinha

Mandatory try out when you come to Porto. A sandwich with sausage, ham, beef, melted cheese on top and a tomato-based sauce for extra yummyness. It goes well with a beer, piri-piri and a side of french fries. Now imagine all that but with exclusively vegetarian ingredients! Yes, it is possible!

The best place we recommend for its vast amount of options, great tastes and low cost is at

Francesinhas Al Forno da Baixa (R. do Almada, 160)

* Feijoada Portuguesa

Nutritionally one of the most complete dishes. It has its origins in the north of Portugal and consists of a beans stew, usually with meat and vegetables, accompanied by white rice. It can easily turn into a vegetarian dish by swapping the meat for mushrooms

The place we recommend to eat this typical portuguese dish is Moment'Um (R. da Estação, 82).

Croissant

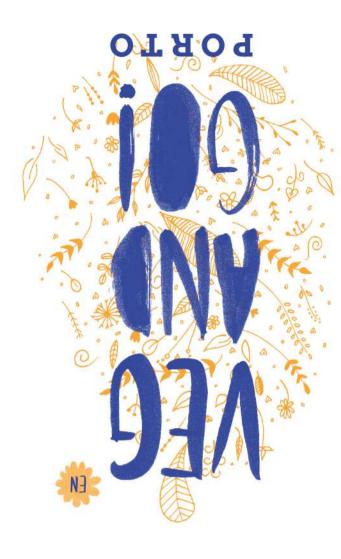
But croissant was not a french thing? No! The portuguese croissant has nothing to do with the french version and that's why you need to try it. This croissant has a brioche dough and is normally filled with cream or chocolate - but you can find the basic version as well.

Cravo & Canela makes a delicious traditional vegan pastry line of croissants, bolas de berlim, pasteis de tentúgal, tartes de amêndoa, rissóis and much more. They are usually at events or taking your special orders (914 406 399), but if you want to taste them all, you can go to Confeitaria Henrique Carvalho (R. Dom Nuno Álvares Pereira, 44) in Matosinhos.

Legumes ou Cogumelos à Brás

As an alternative to Bacalhau à Brás, a traditional portuguese recipe for codfish, people created the plant based version of the dish. You can find it in a vegetable version (Legumes à Brás) or a mushroom version (Cogumelos à Brás).

If you want to try Legumes à Brás, go to Alma Portuense (Praça de Parada Leitão, 17 or R. dos Heróis e dos Mártires de Angola, 41). If you want to taste Cogumelos à Brás, we recommend you Remédio Santo (R. do Campo Alegre, 553).
